

44th Tarleton Scouts – Code of Conduct

This code of conduct has been agreed by all Scouts, Leaders and Group Scout Leader. It has been agreed as a group that these are the rules which should be followed during troop nights and when on camps and outdoor events.

The code of conduct must be adhered to at all times

Expectations of Scouts

- Follow the Scout Law.
A scout is to be trusted, loyal, friendly, considerate, belong to the worldwide family, has courage in difficulties, make use of time, careful of possessions and property, self-respect and respect for others
- Listen whilst being given instructions and spoken to.
- Only speak one at a time and respect other scouts who are talking.
- Act sensible and set a good example at all times. *(This includes when out of the hut in public)*
- **No Mobile Phones** unless instructed by a leader.

Expectations of leaders

- Follow above rules where applicable.
- Listen to Scouts' ideas fully and consider them.
- Wear full uniform on all troop nights to set a good example
Full uniform consists of Scout Shirt and Necker.
- Create a varied and interesting programme for the Scouts.

Agreed procedure for bad behaviour

1. Verbal warning is made to the scout.
2. If second verbal warning is made, Scout will be shown a **yellow** card.
3. If a third warning is given, Scout is shown an **orange** card and parents are informed.
4. Final warning, Scout is shown a **red** card and parents are informed to collect scout. The following week the scout is to attend with parents to discuss their behaviour.
